# Cruising Itineraries Anchorage & Yacht Club Information

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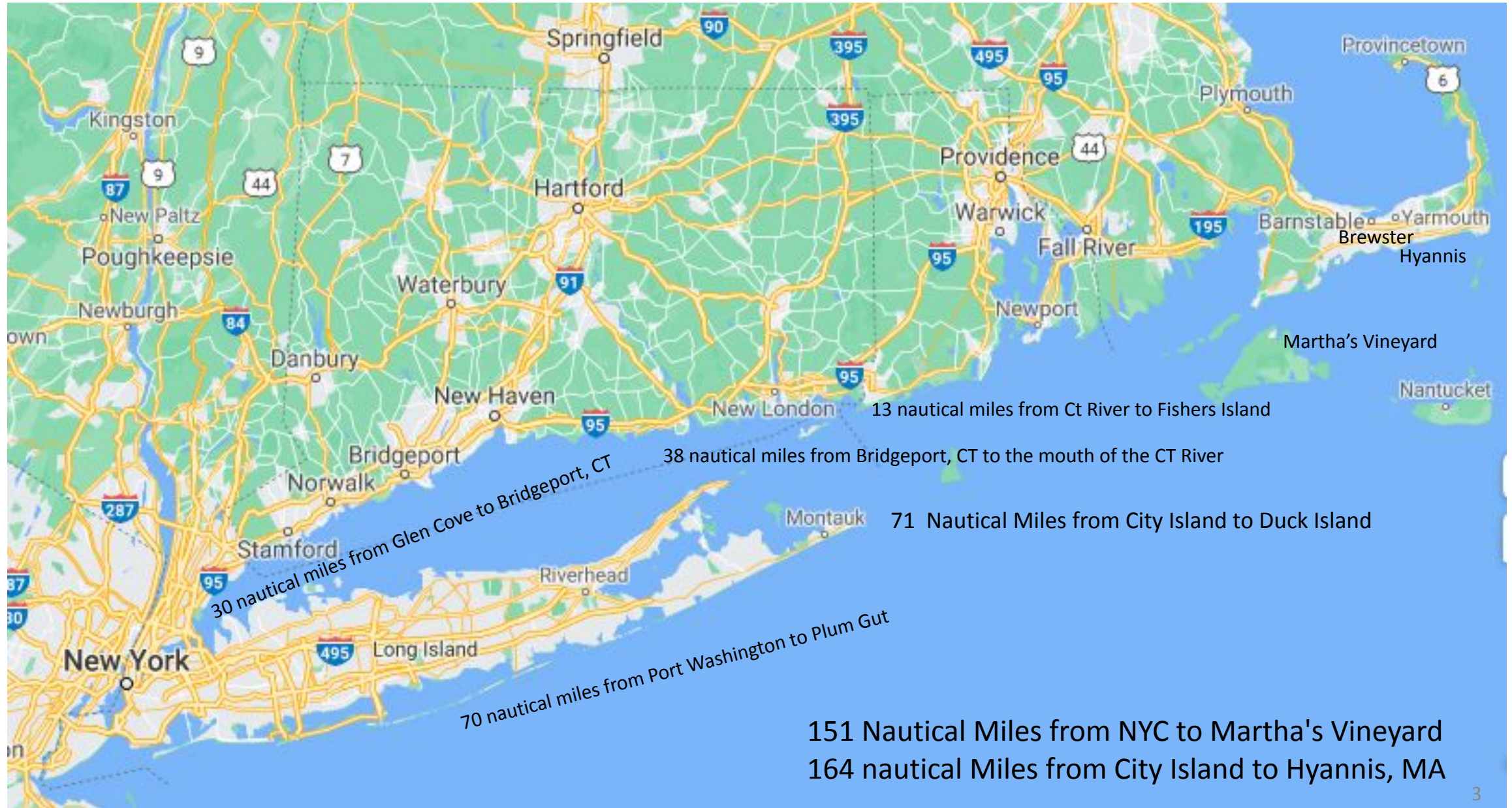

### **2021 Itinerary - August Trip – 3 weeks**

Harlem YC on City Island, 35 nm to Black Rock Yacht Club (mooring balls \$55 per night), 35 nm on to Dick Island in Westbrook, CT, safe, protected anchorage, dinner at Lenny & Joe's Fish Tails in town. 35 nm on to Watch Hill. Safe anchorage in protected harbor. Watch Hill YC has a nice restaurant and bar on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor overlooking the harbor. Most men wore jackets. People at adjacent bar and the few outside tables were casually dressed. Traveled on to Port Judith, RI. Harbor of Refuge - a protected harbor on the ocean, but the depth is 24 feet so you need plenty of anchor line. Safer, quitter anchorages are available way up bay in Port Judith Pond. Ocean fog was also a big issue. Port Judith Pond is near Plato and Gardiner's islands. You have to stay in the channel and watch for shallows but had 0 feet of water.. We then sailed towards Woods Hole, MA on Cape Cod and dropped anchor in Hadley Harbor on the island just before the channel into Woods Hole. We took an orange mooring ball and our sister boat took a private ball without the attached dingy that means a boat is coming back soon. Beautiful, quiet anchorage. Next stop, Hyannis Port YC. The club has one guest mooring ball and a launch that stops early evening. No services on the water. The exclusive club building is a 10-15 minute walk up the road and we didn't attempt a visit. You need a dingy here. We then traveled to Stage Harbor near Chatham and had mooring balls from the Monomoy Yacht Club at about \$45 per night. We took the dingy up the creek and tied up at the Chatham dock. It's a short walk into town for dinner. Beautiful scenic harbor, but no real services at the YC. Water and pump put available at the Harbor Master office.. We returned to Hadley Harbor storm protection.

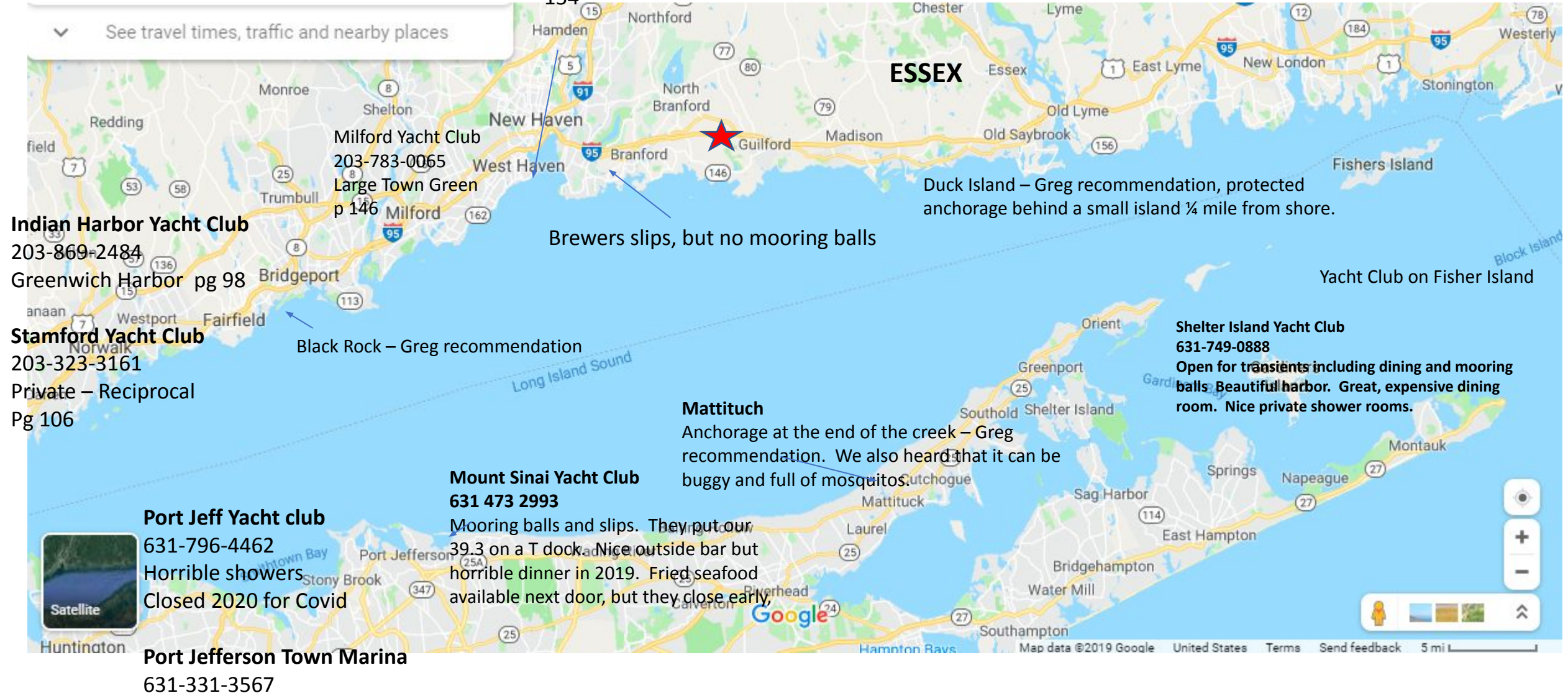

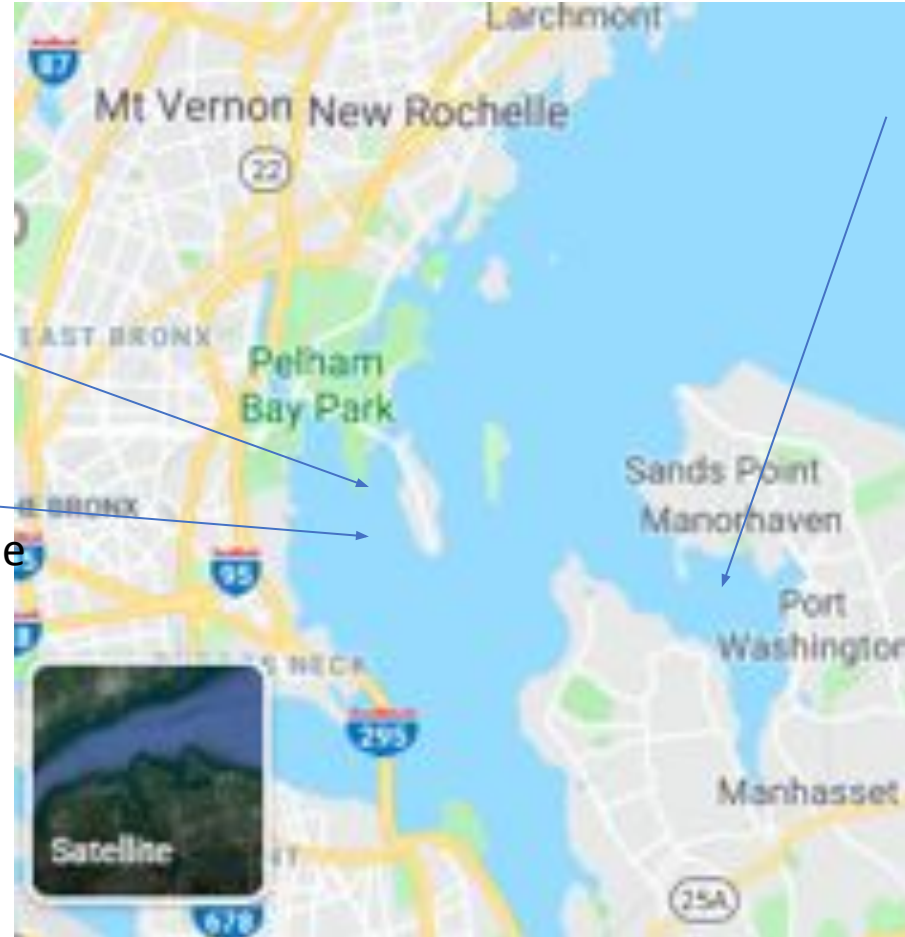

## **Dockage and Moorings**

Guest moorings up to 1000lbs available for visiting yachts. You may arrange for a mooring by emailing [guest-moorings@hyc.org](mailto:guest-moorings@hyc.org), by calling the launch house at 718-885-3235, or by hailing the launch operator. "Harlem Launch" monitors VHF 72 (see the launch hours below). Please do not anchor in the mooring field.

Overnight guest fee is \$35.00. Weekly rates are available upon request. Your fee covers a mooring, use of our launch service, dinghy dock and the club's facilities. Complimentary mooring for lunch or dinner guests during their meal. Fresh water and ice are available at the dock. There is a half hour limit for tie ups. Please check with the launch staff before approaching the docks to make sure the dock is free and the tide cycle will accommodate your draft.

## **Restaurant & Bar**

The club has a full service restaurant and bar. Visiting yachts are welcome to join us for lunch, dinner, or a drink (proper attire required). The clubhouse is open Wednesday through Sunday. Hours vary during the season, [click here](#) for more information.

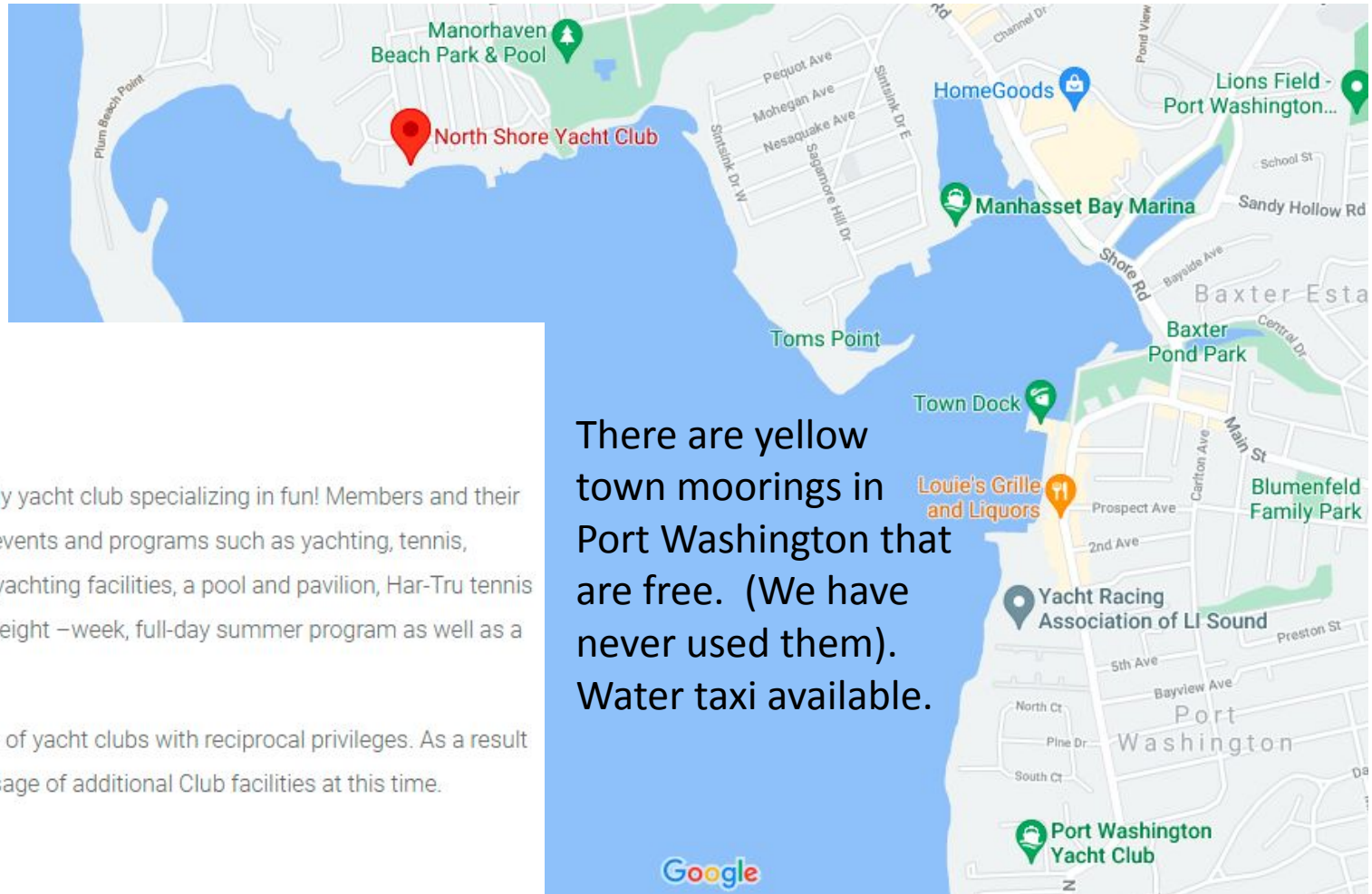
# Port Washington Yacht Club

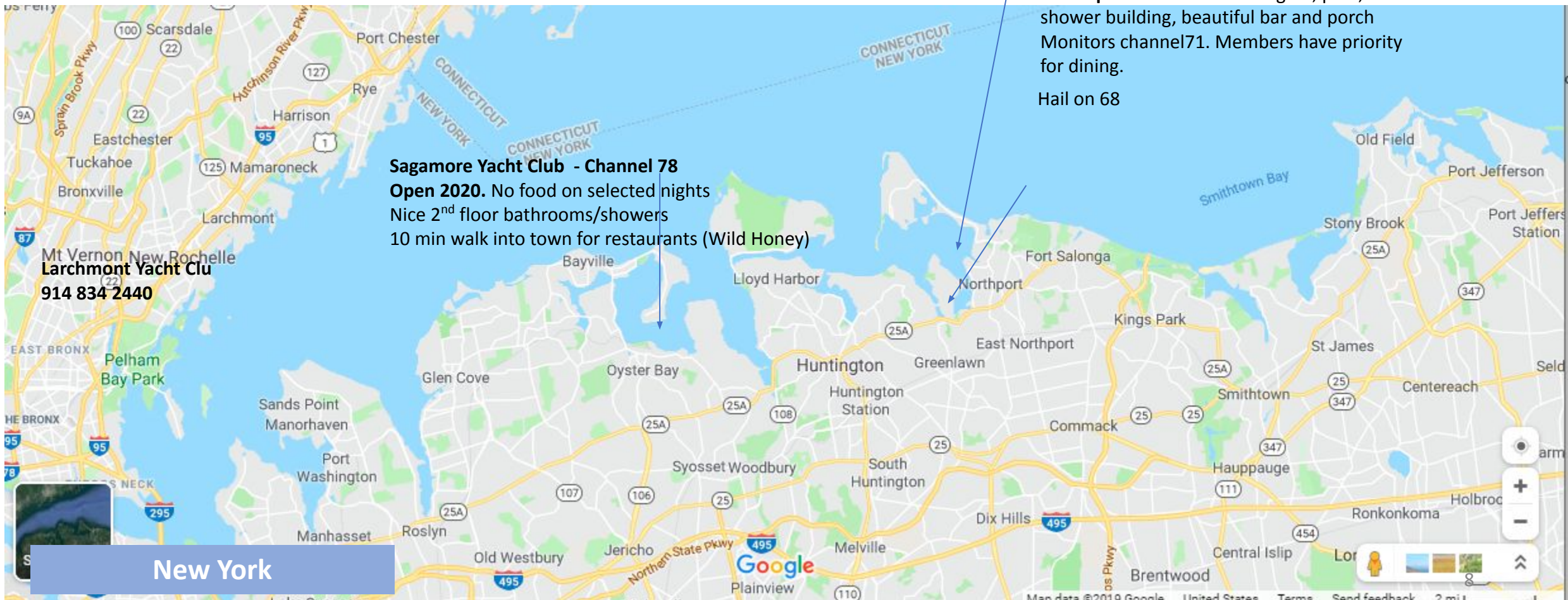

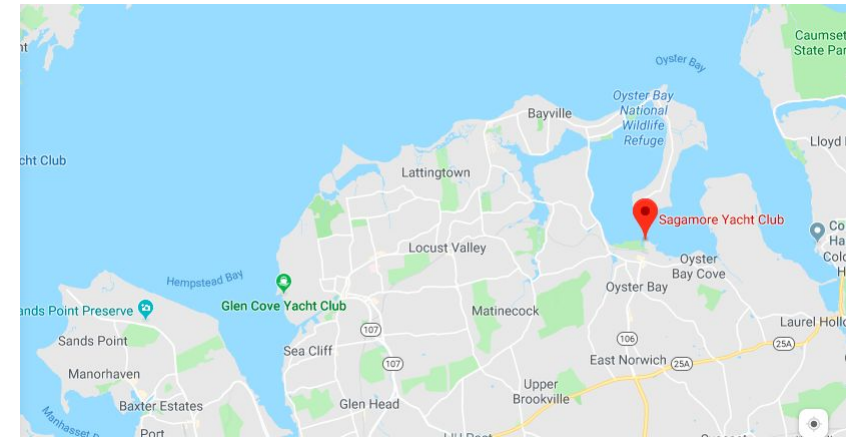

You can also request a mooring by sending email to the dockmaster. Be sure to indicate the date requested and the size and depth of your vessel. 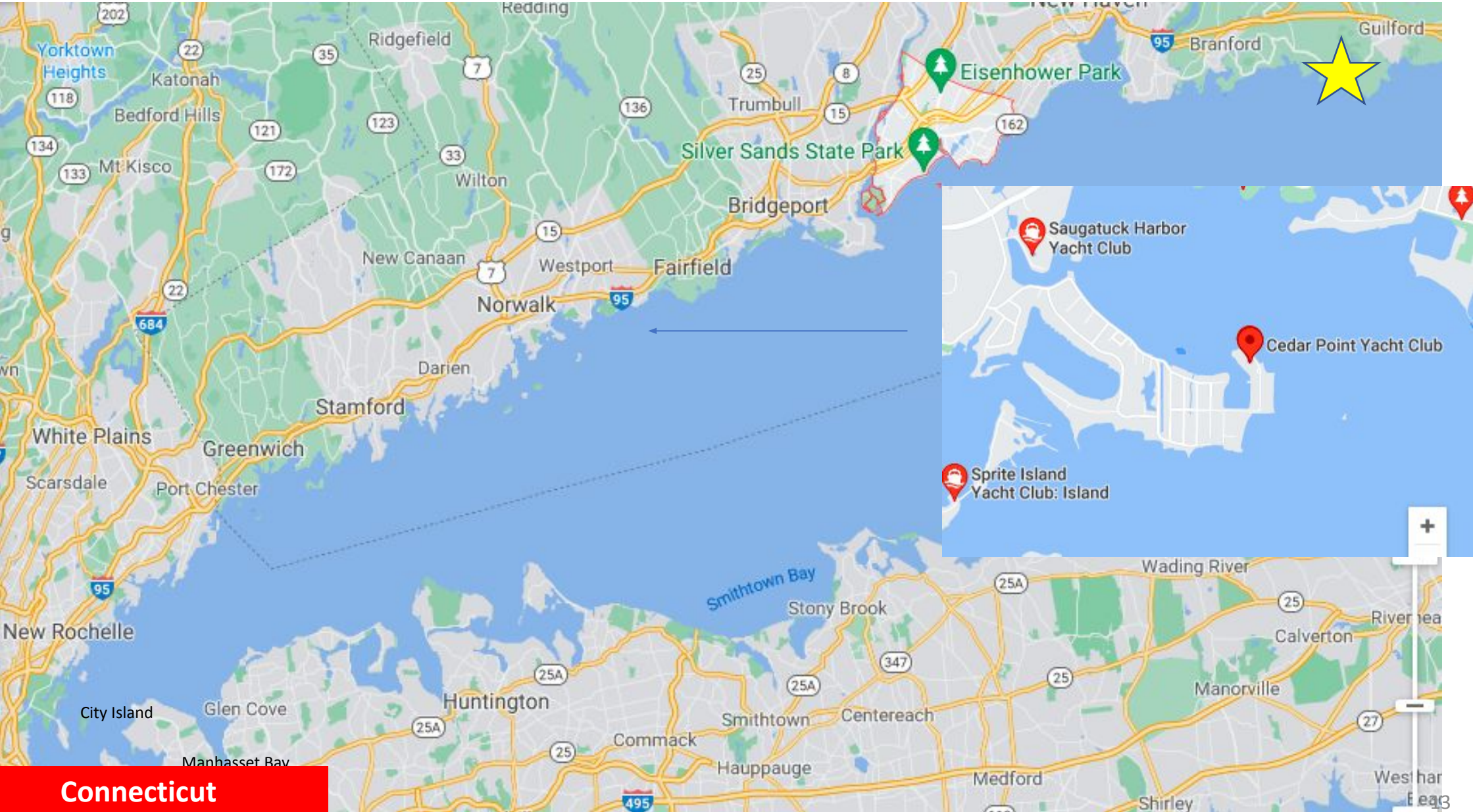

## VISITING YACHTS

The club has a 130-slip basin and space in our drystall for 150 boats.

Cedar Point Yacht Club welcomes visiting yachts, including flotillas from other yacht clubs.

We have dock space and depths to 8' at Mean Low Water (MLW) in our well protected basin on a space-available basis and can usually accommodate cruises from other clubs on holiday weekends. Most slips have 30 amp electric service (a few have 50 amp) and fresh water hookups. Fees are \$4.00 per foot per night plus electric. Gasoline or diesel is available across the harbor entrance at Compo Basin. For planning purposes, a chart of the approach to CPYC can be found below.

Facilities for visitors include grills, beaches, playground, showers, and snack bar. Fine restaurants and shopping are nearby in Westport, CT.

### DIRECTIONS FROM LONG ISLAND SOUND

We welcome visiting yachts and yacht clubs and can accommodate a wide range of vessels for transient dockage. Snugly situated in a well-protected hurricane hole off the Saugatuck River in Westport, the club offers dockage on our floating docks with 30 and 50 amp service for yachts up to 53'. Visiting yachtsmen are welcome to make use of the large pool and showers. A short drive or taxi ride away is the center of the Town of Westport with many shops and great places to enjoy a meal.

Coming from the west leave red bell "24" to port and turn north to green 2.5 sec. flashing can "1" (Georges Rock) making sure to leave it to port to avoid Cockenoe (pron. Ko-kee-nee) Reef, thence to green flasher "3" (Bug Light).

Coming from the South, again, leave green 2.5 sec. flashing can "1" to port and head for green flasher "3" (Bug Light).

Coming from the East, head for the green flasher "3" (Bug Light). From the Bug Light pass between the first pair of river buoys, green can "5" and red nun "6". Slow speed to 5mph from this point on. Pass the Compo Marina channel and follow the green cans as they take you to the west side of the river where you will turn 90 degrees to starboard at red nun "16" (opposite Cedar Point Yacht Club). Give this nun and all the rest up the river a wide berth, staying to the west side of the channel. At red nun "20" enter the SHYC channel between the green and red buoys. Line up the burgee marker on the dock with another on land.

This channel was dredged to 8 feet in 1997. Reach the dock master on VHF Channel 71.

### WELCOME

Pequot Yacht Club is situated in Southport Harbor at the mouth of the Mill River. Approaching our harbor and mooring field can be intimidating, and it is important that all vessels navigate within the federally marked channel. The first vessels moored just past the break wall are part of the town of Fairfield anchorage. All guests should proceed up the harbor toward the fuel dock and call our launch on VHF channel 69. All moored vessels in our anchorage are secured both fore and aft. Other than launch service we have a dinghy dock should visitors wish to use their own tender.

# Western Connecticut Coast Norwalk Islands

## Anchorage at Cockenoe Island

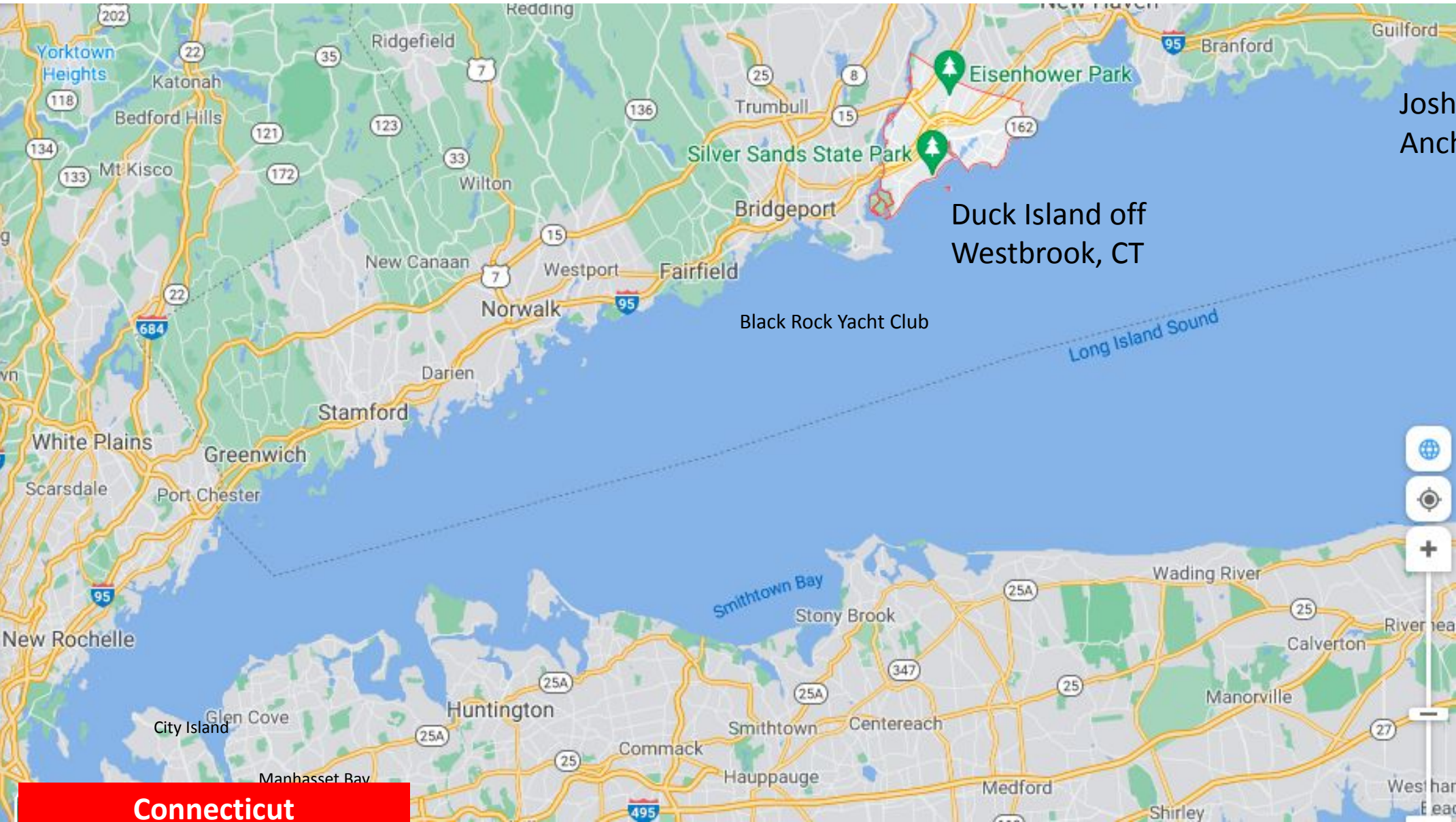
The Norwalk Islands are a chain of more than 25 islands amid partly submerged boulders, reefs and mudflats along a six-mile stretch and mostly about a mile off the coast of Norwalk, Connecticut, and southwest Westport, Connecticut, in Long Island Sound. [Wikipedia](#)



Cockenoe Island is the furthest east, with a long reef extending almost a mile to the east. Cockenoe (pronounced cock-kee-nee) has several spots to anchor. There is an inner harbor, which only has about 3-4 feet of water at low tide. Getting into the inner harbor is impossible at anything less than half tide, due to many shallow spots. Approach from south of the northern sand spit, or around the eastern reef and R "24" / G "1". The area north of the Island offers gradually increasing depths as you move further to the east. There is about 6-7 feet of water off the eastern end. Many people also anchor to the west of the sand spit, where there is over 7' of water, and good access to the beach.

Harbor of Safe Refuge outside the channel into Point Judith Pond provides a sea wall and protected anchorage, but the depth is 24 feet. Quiet and pretty anchorages are available further north in Port Judith Pond.

Point Judith Pond is a shallow, four-mile-long salt body of water lying behind the barrier beaches and sand dunes that form Point Judith Harbor, which lies immediately west of Point Judith in Narragansett, Rhode Island at the southwestern tip of Narragansett Bay.

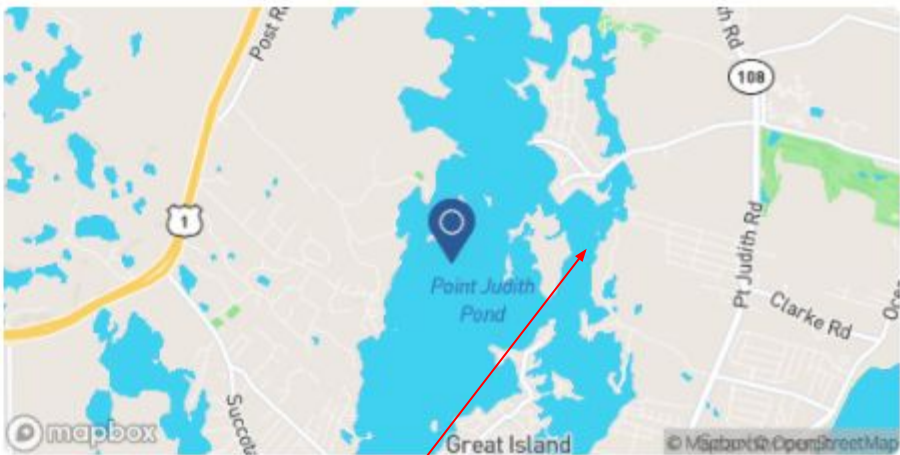

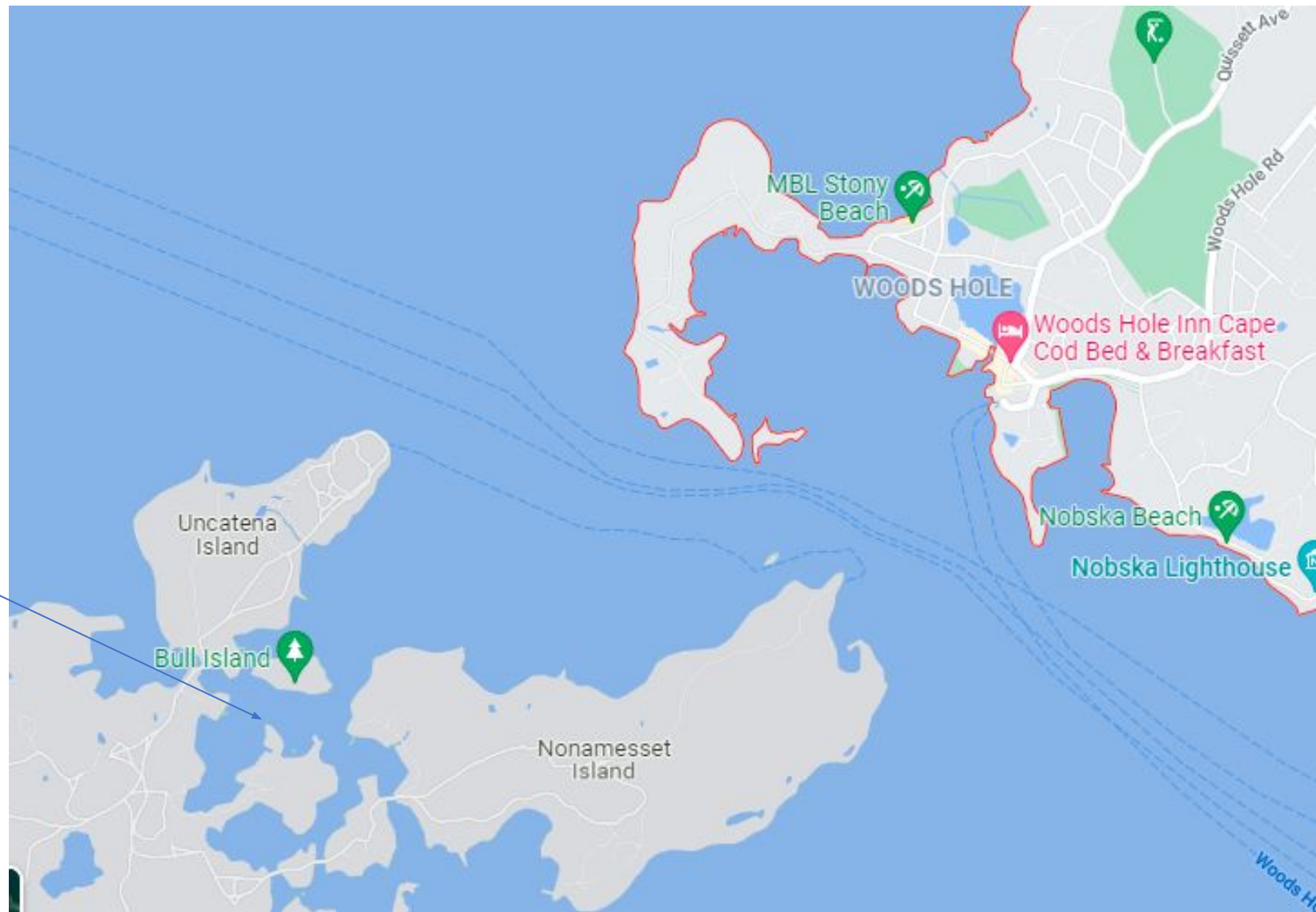

**Hadley Harbor provides protected, safe and beautiful anchorage spots.**

On approaching, pay close attention for the rocks. In fact, when you study the charts for the area, you'll see "Hadley Rks" instead of Hadley Harbor. You can see them as you approach the entrance from Buzzards Bay. As you pass GC11 entering the Wood's Hole Broadway passage, bear to starboard leaving GC11 astern and the rocks to port. As you approach the rocks, you'll see the marked Hadley Harbor channel to the east. You can take that route in also. There are swimmers both inside and outside the harbor so it pays to keep a close eye out.

There are three large Coast Guard moorings inside the harbor, and all other moorings are private. Their owners or guests often leave a dinghy attached to the mooring to let you know they'll be back. There are no other amenities. If you choose to anchor or take a mooring inside, stay clear of the channel used by the private ferry that runs from Woods Hole Harbor to the islands several times a day. Depths range from nine to 15 or 16 feet near the channel. Holding is generally good and the currents that plague Wood's Hole pass by this lovely spot. Because all but a handful of the Elizabeth Islands are privately-owned and maintained, you cannot go ashore here.

# Cape Cod

**Bull Island – open to the public.**

If you find it too crowded for your liking inside the harbor, turn around and head for the anchorage outside the harbor northeast of Bull Island. Bull Island is open to the public. From either inside or outside the harbor, you can dinghy ashore at Bull Island and hike around the island. Dogs are welcome and a large sign tells you to scoop and flush to the holding tank. When going ashore, you may want to wear socks and long trousers to prevent exposure to deer ticks known to carry Lyme Disease. At high tide, you may have to make your way through knee-deep water but it won't take you longer than half an hour to get around.

Outside the channel farther east off Nonamesset Island lies a decent anchorage, although it shoals up near shore.
